

## TOTAL OIG CASE INTAKE PER MONTH


October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019



OIG opened **535** cases from October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019

## **AVERAGE OIG CASE INTAKE PER SCHOOL DAY**

October 1, 2018 through October 11, 2019



OIG opened an average of 2.9 cases per school day from October 1, 2018 through October 11, 2019

July and August are excluded from the 'per school day' calculation because, aside from Summer Programs, school is not in session.

## **CASE INVENTORY**

Summary of all OIG cases opened October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019

**Active cases** 239 Currently under investigation — numerous factors may extend the duration of an investigation, including CPD or DCFS investigations, outstanding OIG subpoenas, and interview scheduling difficulties **Closing cases** 73 OIG investigation is substantially complete **Closed cases** 223 OIG has issued a written summary report regarding the results of its investigation


## OIG SEXUAL ALLEGATION CATEGORIES

Sexual Act	Penetration
Sexual Abuse	Physical conduct for sexual gratification, e.g., groping, fondling
Sexual Comment — In Person	Unambiguously sexual comment to student
Grooming	Actions to break down inhibitions for the purpose of sexual conduct
Sexual Electronic Communication ("Sexting")	Sexual text messages, emails, or other communications
Touching—Less than Sexual Abuse	Touching of a possible (not obvious) sexual nature
Concerning—Other	Leering, "creepy" behavior or other potentially concerning behavior
Student-on-Staff Inappropriate Conduct	Student behavior toward a staff member (now addressed by EOCO)
Outcry About Old Conduct	Recent outcry about allegations from several years ago

Cases are assigned a single category, but may involve behaviors that could fall into multiple categories. **Grooming** cases, for instance, often involve behaviors that could also be categorized as **sexual electronic communication**.

#### CASES BY ALLEGATION CATEGORY

Summary of OIG cases opened October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019, including active, closing, and closed cases. In addition, 2 "concerning: other" cases did not fall within either an elementary school or high school.


Elementary schools and high schools have similar numbers of allegations.

2019-2020 school year 20th-day enrollment data. Several cases did not fall within an ES/HS categorization.

However, per student, the high school allegation rate is about **2.8 times** the elementary school rate.

## **ALLEGATIONS BY SELECT JOB CATEGORY**

Includes all cases opened October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019. There are over 150 other subjects of OIG SAU cases, including 15 Coaches, 14 Principals or Assistant Principals, 10 Bus Drivers or Bus Aides, and 7 Deans.


From December 2018 through April 2019, Non-Charter schools reported **3.1 times as many cases** per 100,000 students as Charter schools.

From May 2019 through September 2019, Non-Charter schools reported **1.6 times as many cases** per 100,000 students as Charter schools.

#### **OIG CLOSED CASES**

#### Summary of all OIG decisions, as categorized by initial allegation


All closed cases through September 30, 2019. A case is "substantiated" when a preponderance of the evidence establishes a violation of CPS policies, rules, or guidelines. A case may be substantiated on different grounds than the initial allegation, and in limited instances, OIG may close and refer a case without making a substantiated or not substantiated determination.



## SUBSTANTIATED CASES

#### Summary of most significant factual finding in each case

Includes all substantiated cases with a decision issued between October 1, 2018 and September 30, 2019. Substantiated cases may involve multiple policy violations. Here, each case is categorized by the most significant finding.

# **PERSONNEL ACTIONS**

As of September 30, 2019

Pulled or Blocked	96 adults have been pulled or blocked (specific to substitute teachers) from school pending investigation, including 22 currently-pulled teachers.
Reinstated	22 pulled or blocked individuals have been reinstated based on OIG's recommendation, following investigation that found allegations not substantiated.
Terminated or resigned/retired	57 adults who were subjects of an investigation were terminated or resigned/retired after the commencement of an OIG investigation.
